

Our **HPCA Preschool** had the highest attendance in the last five years with 92 students enrolled in our program. These little ones, ranging from 18 months to four-year-olds, had a year filled with growth, handson learning, songs, laughter, and love!



Our Preschool is **unique** in the way we are able to offer a half-day program for families, supplemented with full-day care. This allows us to meet the needs of stay-at-home moms to dual working parents and everything inbetween! The 2019-2020 Elementary academic school year was filled with learning, laughter, love, compassion, and growth. Over 190 students – TK-5th grades, excelled in their academic, spiritual, emotional, and physical growth throughout the year. Our elementary program showcases teachers who pour the love of Jesus into these inquisitive, joyful minds each day.

Over the course of this past year, our **TK** and **Kindergarten students** served as role models for our Preschool Fours as they assisted with crafts and reading programs. What a great way for students to take on leadership roles at such a young age! They embraced our new "Letter Land" curriculum, which teaches alphabet phonics in a visual and interactive manner.

First Grade students memorized the Old Testament books of the Bible, dressed up on Dr. Seuss Day, and excelled with their reading and math skillset. They blossomed and matured into independent thinkers and learners throughout the year.


The Junior Beta Club is available by nomination – only to middle school students who excel in their academic achievements, character, service, and leadership.

Our 6th, 7th, and 8th Graders rule third floor domain of middle school! Academics compel students into the worlds of Life and Earth Sciences, US History, Algebra and a complete overview of the Bible.

Middle schoolers bond together participating in spirit week festivities; creating memories at Merriwood; watching their homemade volcanoes explode; serving others via their Servant's Heart Project; Math Olympics; local, district and national Spelling Bee competitions; and various other extracurricular activities.

Middle school students visited with Christian author, Tessa Emily Hall, who shared her Christian fiction books and experiences as a young Christian writer to encourage middle schoolers and personally sign books.

Sixth grade students enjoyed the unit "In His Image." Students studied different cultures from around the world and celebrated how each group exemplifies the Divine Mandate. Three guest speakers from our HPCA community shared about their native cultures, including Liju Matthews - India; Makara Jones - Vietnam; and Comfort Boateng - Ghana. Each speaker also shared prayer needs for their birth countries. This compelling and powerful experience challenged middle schoolers to truly grow in their appreciation and awareness of other cultures made "In His Image."

High SCHOOL

Students in Grades 9th–12th experienced a high level of academics, partnered with innovative learning throughout the year. With our one-to-one Chromebook program, all high school students have technology at their fingertips for use in their classroom setting and at home.

High School students participate in a variety of extracurricular activities, including International Club, Interact Club, National Honor Society, Science National Honor Society and more in addition to the AAs and athletics programs.

High School students embraced many opportunities in their first **Day of Service** this year. All high school students left campus for the day to serve individuals and organizations within our community. Organizations served included Title One schools, the YWCA, Senior Center, New Life Family Outreach, West End Ministries, and more! Students and faculty spent the day focusing on the needs of others in our community while demonstrating the love and kindness of Jesus Christ.

Each year our High School hosts **international students** from across the globe. This year we have 14 international students from Burma, Germany, Spain, South Korea, China, Hungary, Costa Rica, and Brazil. Great discoveries occur as culture is shared. International student, Alejandro Mejia, was featured in several media spotlights when packing a shoebox for our Operation Christmas Child shoebox project resurrected a distant memory of receiving such a shoebox himself when he was younger. This story touched the hearts of our students and faculty.

Throughout the years students of all grade levels have packed shoeboxes to send across the globe, never expecting that a recipient of one of these boxes would be a student at our school!

Blessings showered the high school campus this year in various ways. One was the remarkable recovery of 10th grade student, Maxx DeFord. After being diagnosed with a brain tumor, and surviving

brain surgery, the high school gathered around in support and love as Maxx made his way back into the classroom. Maxx's story is certainly evidence of power of prayer and dependence on God.






Online LEARNING


