SCHOOL

High Point Christian Academy, established in 1996, is a PS-12 college preparatory school providing quality education through a Biblical worldview. The class of 2006 was the first graduating class. The high school schedule is organized on an A/B day block schedule. Students attend four 90-minute block classes each day. Block classes are year-long and each block class meets every other day.

ENROLLMENT

Over 896 students attend HPCA with over 240 in grades 9-12. There are 48 students in the class of 2025. Admission is open to all qualified students and is based on academic records, admission testing, recommendations, and personal interview.

ACCREDITATION

High Point Christian Academy is accredited by both the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Association of Christian Schools International.

GPA / RANKING

Grades earned at other schools apply toward graduation requirements and are calculated in the unweighted GPA but are not calculated into the weighted GPA.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND DUAL ENROLLMENT

All students enrolled in AP courses are required to take the AP exam associated with that course. With 129 exams, our pass rate for AP exams was 77% for the 2024-2025 school year. Approximately 30% of 10th-12th grade students are enrolled in at least one AP course.

Beginning in 11th grade, students are able to take dual enrollment classes through the Career and College Promise program at local community colleges. Grades earned in dual enrollment classes are not included in the student's weighted GPA calculation. Approximately 15% of 11th and 12th grade students are enrolled in at least one dual enrollment course.
