SCHOOL High Point Christian Academy, established in 1996, is a PS-12 college preparatory school providing quality education through a Biblical worldview. The class of 2006 was the first graduating class. The high school schedule is organized on an A/B day block schedule. Students attend four 90-minute block classes each day. Block classes are year-long and each block class meets every other day.

ENROLLMENT Over 850 students attend HPCA with over 240 in grades 9-12. There are 59 students in the class of 2024. Admission is open to all qualified students and is based on academic records, admission testing, recommendations, and personal interview.

ACCREDITATION High Point Christian Academy is accredited by both the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Association of Christian Schools International.
