


A COMMITMENT TO ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH

Elementary education also lays the foundation for future learning much like the building of a strong house. Education at High Point Christian Academy is a partnership between the parent, the school, and the church.



Students have access to 1:1 Chromebooks, AP classes, and online electives in the high school, while all ages enjoy smart boards, 3D printers, iPads, robotics, and more!

If you feel your child is not ready to advance to kindergarten but has already completed a preschool program, transitional kindergarten is an excellent option. Giving children extra time to master certain skills is often the greatest gift a parent can provide.

Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

READING AND WRITING

Students begin learning how to read and write using phonics-based curriculum.

Transitional kindergarten and kindergarten students are encouraged to begin the writing process the first day of school.

Developmentally appropriate literature is used to teach character, develop themes and increase their understanding of parts of speech.

SOCIAL STUDIES

throughout the school year through various activities as young minds develop a sense of self in relation to the community.

Students also learn about many different countries around the world. Learning about the people God has created everywhere deepens students' understanding and appreciation for a variety of cultures which increases their empathy for others.

MATH

Our math curriculum gives a framework for understanding numeration and its symbols and introduces students to the order of the mathematical world. Discovery of mathematical problems and solutions is integrated throughout the day using math manipulatives and in coordination with language, social studies and science units.

SCIENCE

Investigation of the natural environment allows students to begin their understanding of scientific thinking and develop hypotheses. Scientific investigation and observation also opens doors to understanding God's world.

BIBLE

The Bible is woven and integrated throughout all areas of learning. Students learn through Bible stories that God has a plan and purpose for their lives, and that He loves and cares for them.

Students are able to observe the order and beauty of God's creation.

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF AN HPCA YOUNG ELEMENTARY STUDENT

Mornings include written activities, hands-on experimenting and reading time. Students thrive in our Cougar environment that includes the use of smart boards, manipulatives, crafts and a variety of tools to enhance the fine motor skills of these little hands.

Our younger elementary students are paired with older elementary students who serve as reading buddies throughout the year to foster relationships and continue to build a love of reading.

Academically, these young minds will explore countries across the globe, mathematical problems, pie charts, science experiments, and most importantly, they will learn of the love of Jesus in each aspect of their curriculum.

Lunch includes a variety of hot and fresh meal options in our Dining Commons prepared on site and offered daily. Meal options range from chicken tenders with macaroni and cheese and green beans, to personal pan pizzas with fresh fruit.

Outdoor free play is essential for a child's growing mind. Students enjoy recess daily, which encourages imagination, benefits social skills, and promotes physical wellness.

Daily rest time is enjoyed by our youngest elementary students each afternoon. This affords young minds and bodies the chance to decompress prior to heading home for the day.

TK and Kindergarten special enrichment activities include:

- Daily classroom worship Biblically integrated curriculum and bi-monthly chapels are only part of the worship and ministry opportunities for our students to embrace.
- Physical Education Students are taught basic skills for running, throwing, jumping, and kicking, as well as spacial awareness.
- Music Beginning in preschool, Cougar students begin making music by singing, dancing, and playing classroom instruments.
- Art TK and Kindergarten students have the opportunity to explore their creativity.
- Tech Lab Students are taught through hands-on learning with the use of computers, robotics, and 3D printing.
- Media Center Students are given the chance to participate in reada-louds in all genres and have the ability to check out books weekly to enjoy at home.

Parents receive daily communication from teachers.

Morning drop-off begins at 7:30 am and afterschool care is offered until 6:00 pm.
