- Is a member in good standing at a local, evangelical church which has a Statement of Faith that is in agreement with HPCA's Statement of Faith.
- Has an undergraduate or master's degree in 9 -12 Physical Education or a degree that is equivalent.
- Has an ACSI teaching certificate or state teaching certificate in physical education in grades 9-12 or is willing to obtain a teaching certificate.
- Demonstrates pedagogical understanding of students in grades 9-12 and has experience in teaching students weight lifting techniques.
- Demonstrates experience in a school setting, teaching physical education to high school students, and coaching football in a school setting (preferably a Christian school setting).
- Has the ability to orchestrate a highly organized, exciting, and dynamic learning environment in the classroom and the football field.
- Has the ability to lead a football program (Varsity and JV) and can lead/organize a group of coaches to pursue a like-minded mission.
- Has integrity, sound judgement, self-confidence, maturity, and a sense of perspective which means that he develops appropriate relationships with students and families.
- Has excellent interpersonal, presentation, writing, organizational, and communication skills and able to reflect a positive image for the HPCA community in public settings and through media outlets.
- Has a commitment for excellence in athletics while strictly adhering to all competitive, organizational, and operational guidelines as defined by the NCISAA and HPCA.
- Is a self-starter and initiator, and is able to work independently and effectively on a team.
