Research

1

- Identify your personal interests, gifts, and talents
- Reach out to parents, teachers, or the KIP Team (Mrs. Walker, Mrs. Oweis, or Mr. Doyle) to ask for help and ideas .
- Research a need in the community: organizations, ministries, etc.
- Contact the potential community organization and explain your project idea. Then, identify a project supervisor who can be your contact person and verify your service hours.

Proposal

2

- Complete the ONLINE proposal form (Click Here to Access)
 - Due no later than **September 12, 2025**.
 - The EARLIER you submit your proposal - the better! Many students like to complete their project over the summer.
- The KIP Team will contact you to set up an interview date/time to review your proposal.
- ***You must wait for approval before you start your project***

Plan

3

- Contact the project supervisor and inform them of your approval and start date
- Make a list of any needs: materials, supplies, etc.
- Manage your time to ensure you are able to to complete the 30 service hours (unpaid)

Execute

4

- Complete and document all service hours on the Volunteer Log.
- Take pictures of your project execution; showing planning, organizing, and service.
- Take 10 pictures - five of which include yourself for your presentation.

Final

5

- Complete all KIP related assignments in Senior English and UTT classes. Students receive project instructions from teachers throughout your senior year.
- The completed volunteer log with the project supervisor's signature and all photos, will be turned in with your final UTT class presentation.
